



All media including fine crafts will be accepted.

- Size Limitations: 3D (ie. sculpture) maximum 6ft in height, 2ft in width, 2ft in depth. 2D (ie. paintings) maximum 4ft in height, 4ft in width.
- Work that is not properly framed and/or ready to be hung or displayed will not be eligible. 2D works (ie. paintings) must be wired.
- Work done in class, under instruction, copied from another source or previously exhibited in the Gallery at the Cambridge Centre for the Arts is not eligible for submission.
- A non-refundable fee of \$10 per artwork must accompany the work submitted. This fee includes up to two (2) pieces of artwork. Credit card, debit, cash or cheque accepted. Please make cheques payable to the Cambridge Centre for the Arts. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
